The 76th Annual Meeting of the Japan Radiological Society (JRS) will be held on April 13-16, 2017, in Yokohama, Japan in conjunction with the 73rd Annual Scientific Congress of the Japanese Society of Radiological Technology (JSRT), the 113th Scientific Meeting of the Japan Society of Medical Physics (JSMP), and the International Technical Exhibition of Medical Imaging (ITEM) 2017.
